## Joint statement from the chambers of commerce and industry of the Three Seas initiative countries

Chambers of commerce and industry of the Three Seas initiative countries met at the annual Three Seas Summit and Business Forum together with the Ukrainian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, American Chamber of Commerce in Latvia, and Canadian Chamber of Commerce in Latvia. Regional security after February 24, 2022 has been changed as well as political, economic and social arrangements. In the light of the current situation, the chambers would like to stress:

- 1. We must do everything we can to stop the war by ensuring the victory of Ukraine.
- 2. Ukraine's territorial integrity is not negotiable.

- 3. The Three Seas initiative countries must help Ukraine to the greatest extent possible right now and continue doing so in the long term.
- 4. Determining prohibition to imports of natural gas, oil and coal from aggressor countries into the European Union.
- 5. Need to protect and implement western values being attacked by Russia.
- 6. Support Ukraine in its willingness to become a member state of the European Union.
